The Inland Empire Four Wheelers welcome all guests to participate in club functions such as runs, business meetings, Roundups, and social gatherings. However, we would also like to welcome in our guests as full time members. As an IE4W member, you will enjoy certain benefits, just to name a few; you will be allowed to purchase plaques to display on your vehicle, you will be allowed full voting rights for bylaw changes and board of directors elections and look toward some new fun members benefits in the coming months as our membership committee builds new ideas.

The followings are the requirements set forth by the IE4W bylaws for membership requirement: Each prospective member must be 18 years or older, hold a valid driver's license, be the registered owner of a 4x4 vehicle, have the minimum CA insurance coverage, have their vehicle safety inspected, and attend 6 business meeting and drive his or her vehicle in at least 6 official runs (1 being an overnight run and 1 Adopt-A-Trail work trip) within a 12 month period. An official club run consists of 2 or more club members (with the exception of monthly club Runs). Each new member must sign the club's Assumption of Risk Waiver and will pay an annual \$69.00 fee which is used for land use and club events. Each year new land disputes surface and every off-highway recreationalist is beckoned to help support the fight. So, not only will your IE4W membership be a fun, fellowship filled experience, you will also be supporting your right to enjoy off-highway recreational areas for years to come.



Exactly How Much is "Too Much"?

Do you have any idea how many pounds your vehicle was designed and engineered to safely carry? Consider your Motorhome, 5th wheel, Toy Hauler, or your flatbed trailer. All these have been designed and engineered to carry a maximum weight based on the size of the frame, suspension components, axles, bearings, wheels and tires. All vehicles are rated and posted either in your vehicle or in the literature that came with your vehicle. As an example, my motorhome has a published weight rating for both the front axle and rear axle in Gross Axle Weight Rating. My published rating is 7000 LB. (front GAWR) and 13500 LB (rear GAWR). This published rating includes the tires by type, size and pressure.

When the Motorhome, trailer, or 5th Wheel is fully loaded with all your gear, all fresh water tanks are full, and fuel tanks are full. It is a great idea to spend a couple dollars and stop by a set of scales to weigh the motorhome, or in my case the front axle, the rear axle, and then the towed vehicle (TJ Jeep). I did this one day after fueling up at the Arco in Salton City at the CAT Scales for only \$9.00 in 2010. They talk you through the scales and tell you when to proceed, stop, and continue to check each axle.

The final report from the scale visit was printed out for my record. I took the scale's reported weights and compared them to the published maximum weight ratings. I learned the front axle weight was 5940 LBs out of 7000 max, the rear axle weight was 11460 LBs out of 13000 max. and the Jeep weighed 4580 LBs. Now I have the answer to the question of how much is too much and I don't have "too much". Now I know my weights are below the max and can be certain that my brakes, tires, and all components can handle the carried weight safely. My question for you is – Are you Safely Loaded or do you carry TOO MUCH? Avoid overloading which places stress and fatigue on primary components as this can lead to catastrophic failures, and That's Not Safe.

As often, the video I have provided is deceiving, and the team will agree that the terrain was more critical than depicted in the video.

Todd surprised us with a nice snack. He sacrificed a pig at his altar, barbequed ole Elmer, and then served his burnt offerings to us. Todd even provided us with latex gloves.

The team kept in communication with each other regarding road terrain changes, and assessments. After completing 2N17x, we took a vote as to which way we would exit the mountains. A majority decided to take 2N33 'Pilot Rock' back to Highway 173, and we all stayed together.

Our rigs endured no carnage, but more importantly no one was injured except for one. Evidently I forgot my own words at the drivers meeting, that no one gets hurt on the trip. I experienced a serious roll over. I rolled over and over and over down a steep hill. But thankfully it was my own body that rolled, and not my Jeep. It's amazing how our highly modified rigs can be more coordinated than our own bodies.
